
The Roman Gladiators




A Gladiator's Life



- As Rome expanded, it came into contact with other cultures which often lead to armed conflict
- A majority of the men, women and children of their conquered lands became slaves
- The conquered were escorted back to Rome where they would be sold in slave markets
 - Often, a strong, soldieraged man would be sold as a gladiator


A Gladiator's Life

- These men were sent to a ludus gladiatorius to be trained
- Training took place under the supervision of an ex-gladiator
 - o Called a lanista, "butcher"
- Both physical and psychological abuse was common
 - Whipping was the most common
- The average day consisted of lifting weights, getting fit and learning the art of death
 - Fresh gladiators were given wooden swords until they could be trusted with metal



A Gladiator's Life

- A common misunderstanding is that only slaves were gladiators
- Other men were included in the race of gladitors, including criminals, bankrupt Romans, and those condemned to death
- These men would be trained based on their physical attributes



Samnite

- Carried a sword
 - gladius
- Had a long shield
 - scutum
- Wore a visored helmet
 - galea



Samnite

Retiarius

- Carried a trident
 - tridens
- Used a net to snare his opponent
 - rete
- Wore amour for his throwing arm
 - galerus



Murmillo

- Carried a dagger
 - sica
- Carried a shield
 - parma
- Protected by leg bands and a leather belt




Thraex

- Used a small shield
 - parma
- Carried a carved daggar
 - sica
- Wore greaves on both legs
 - ocrea



Andabatus

- Wore an eyeless helmet
- Charged opponents on horseback



- Dimachaerius
 - Carried two swords
 - gladius
 - Wore little armour



Laquerius

- Tried to snare his opponents with a lasso
 - laqueum
- Opposite arm is protected with armor
 - galeus
- Similar to a retarius



- Secutor
 - Wore light armor
 - Chased opponent



- Hoplomachus
 - Armed only with a spear
 - hasta
 - Small shield and light armor




Bestiarius

- Specialized in fighting animals
- Typically lightly armed
- Used only whips or spears
 - flagellum
 - hasta




The Fights

- A gladiator fought at the Colosseum, concerned about survival and what the *lanista* would do if he did not perform well
- Gladiators fought once for sport, not necessarily with the intent to kill
- Gladiators fought again in late day but it is to the death now




Colosseum


- Built by Emperor Vespasian and Titus,
- Named for nearby statue of Nero
- Seated 45,000 with seating based on social class
- Hosted:
 - Exotic animal hunts
 - venationes
 - Gladiatorial fights
 - munera
 - Executions
 - carnificera
 - Plays
 - carmines
 - Mock naval battles
 - naumachia



- Defeated gladiators could appeal for mercy but it was up to the crowd. The emperor or host of the event would give the judgment
 - Thumbs down did not mean death. It meant to spare the gladiator and a thumb up meant to kill him
 - Therefore, death did not always come at the hands of one's opponent
